


What is a Gonfalon?

You may even have seen them on the television on shows like "Game of Thrones" or "Vikings"; even after all that you may still wonder, "What exactly is a gonfalon?"

Gonfalon Shapes & Sizes

Gonfalons most commonly come in three styles or shapes being pointed, swallowtail, or straight bottom. Historically, gonfalons came with several streamers at the bottom but nowadays this is less common and will typically only be seen in religious services.










pointed bottom

There are really no rules for which style of gonfalon you pick. The choice comes down to precedent (if your institution has previously used a particular style of gonfalon) or preference. However, the most common type of gonfalon produced is pointed. Gonfalons can be produced in any size.






Hybrid


The third option is a hybrid gonfalon, which combines both appliqué and print. In this process typically the emblem is printed then appliquéd onto the gonfalon. The text is appliquéd as well. The end product combines the results only achieved through print with the quality and craftsmanship of appliqué. It is a nice marriage of the two processes!






Table Banner

Backdrops

Backdrop banners are the ideal method of communicating school pride with your audience at graduation. Ribbons/Tippets

A commencement tippet is a type of academic regalia worn during graduation ceremonies. It is a long, narrow piece of cloth that is worn over the gown. It is worn by graduates and faculty members during the commencement ceremony. The tippet is a symbol of academic achievement and is a traditional part of graduation ceremonies in many countries.

A commencement ribbon is a decorative ribbon worn by graduates during commencement ceremonies. It is typically a small piece of ribbon that is pinned to the front of the graduation gown, often personalized with the name of the institution or the graduation year.


